“We are facing difficult times: The still ongoing Covid-19 pandemic has led to restrictions imposed on human rights unknown since the end of the Second World War, the foundation of the United Nations and the establishment of the modern human rights architecture. Indeed, the health crisis has become a human rights crisis, but it can only be solved on the basis of human rights. Due to the manifold restrictions on human rights that have been imposed to tackle the pandemic, everybody has become aware that we are exercising human rights every day. The pandemic has highlighted how crucial human rights are in our daily lives. Knowing and understanding human rights has been proven to be of outstanding relevance. Correspondingly, we want to offer assistance with the Human Rights Master, responding to the right to have access to lifelong human rights education and training as recognized in the United Nations Declaration on Human Rights Education and Training (A/RES/66/137 of 19 December 2011).”

Content and Facts

The one-year (60 ECTS) postgraduate program “Human Rights” of the University of Vienna has a clear jurisprudential profile. It is, however, not confined to teaching abstract legal theories but will also convey practical skills that are necessary for working in the field of human rights.

Based on the academic excellence of the University of Vienna and on the expertise of the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute of Fundamental and Human Rights for conducting applied research, this postgraduate program can best be described with the words: “Where Science meets Practice!”

The master program addresses the multi-layered field of human rights and reflects different relevant legal frameworks, as well as the corresponding protection mechanisms. Topics covered by the program will be, i. a., legal human rights know-how including theoretical foundations of international human rights protection, methodology, as well as necessary competences for people working in a human rights-related environment. Depending on the educational background of participants there are two alternative compulsory modules: For non-lawyers an introduction to legal studies will be offered. To elaborate on the combination of theoretical knowledge with practical skills, lawyers have to participate in a trial simulation (“Moot Court”).

They will be able to assess current challenges to human rights protection and to develop strategies within the human rights protection framework. Graduates will be able to make use of their skills and knowledge in a broad variety of contexts, ranging from private business to public service, as well as academia.

Target Group

The postgraduate program is aimed at graduates who wish to specialize in human rights, in particular law graduates, but also graduates from other disciplines. The program is open for those who recently graduated, but shall also enable employed persons, for example in public administration, academia, the education sector, NGOs and civil society, as well as the private sector (e.g. corporate lawyers, attorneys, legal trainees, consultants) to participate. Completing the Human Rights Master will ensure that participants can adequately address and integrate human rights into their future work.
